COVER STORY Take a Look Around! Esha Velip: SYBA

The path for students from Quepem court bus stop to college is quite a long one. Sometimes it's boring and other times our friends make it joyful for us. But the good thing is, we have our ways to fight against this boredom. Nature is an excellent observatory! Our college is in the midst of Nature, 'TAKE A LOOK AROUND' and enjoy yourself, with amazing unique flowers, fruits, trees, insects and fill your basket of knowledge! Here are some of the flowers, plants which you can observe on your way from bus stop till college

Crepe - Ginger

Cheilocostus speciosus or Crepe Ginger is a native herb that can grow to 3 m in height. It has beautiful inflorescence and lush vegetation. Its leaves are oblong to lance-shaped, arranged spirally along the reddish slender stems. The flowering spike is dark red, round, each flower is white, funnel shaped with a yellow centre emerge from between the bracts. The flowers look like crepe paper - thus is the common name of crepe ginger. After the flowers fade away, the beautiful red cone-shaped bracts remain. Interestingly what we see, the large crepy white object is not the petal, but the stamen of the flower - the three true petals, of each flower are inconspicuous, and are almost hidden by the bell shaped stamen.

Crepe Ginger also has got many uses in Ayurveda, where the rhizome has been used to treat fever, rash, asthma, bronchitis, and intestinal worms. It is mentioned in the *Kama Sutra* as an ingredient in a cosmetic.





Leea Indica

Leea indica is an erect shrub to small tree, often with several stems. It belongs to family Vitaceae . It usually grows from 2 - 10 metres tall, with stems around 19cm in diameter. Plants are frequently stilt-rooted. It bears small seeds, round in shape and are often eaten by bulbul.

Leea indica can be used in Food and in medicines as well. Leaves and tender shoots are cooked as vegetables. Its flowers are very small and greenish white in color.

Acacia Auriculiformis

Acacia auriculiformis is an evergreen tree. The trunk of this tree is crooked and the bark vertically fissured. Roots are shallow and spreading. It has dense foliage with an open, spreading crown. We can also observe it's arranged in an inflorescence of dense rigid spikes.

These are some of the common trees, which we see around a lot. They were also grown as an initiative of afforestation. Since this is an alien species to India, it became invasive for the native species, later government also took some measures to help with this problem.





Celosia Flamingo

The inflorescence consists of dense terminal spikes, Celosia Flamningo is from familiy Amaranthaceae that we grow in our gardens for production of its showy, edible, variegated leaves and beautiful flower spikes. The celosia flower is already quite dry in nature, lasting a long time on the plant and even longer in a vase, therefore sometimes it's also grown as an oranamentel in gardens. The flowers can range from pink, red to yellow in nature. In India , these flowers are very common. People also treat them as weeds in garden.

International year of Millets, 2023 Talk on 'Ragi Cultivation Practices'

The Department of Botany in view of International year of Millets, 2023, organized a talk on 'Ragi Cultivation Practices' on 30th June 2023. The talk was delivered by Dr. Dhillan Velip, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, Govt. College of Arts, Science and Commerce, Quepem-Goa. Professor Mehtab Bukhari, Head of Botany Department addressed the students and introduced the guest speaker. Dr. Dhillan Velip briefed the students about different varieties of millets and spoke about cultivation practices of Ragi. He also highlighted on the preparation of several value-added products and the use of ragi straw for dairy production. The nutritional and health benefits of Ragi were also discussed by him. Dr. Dhillan also informed students about various promotional activities of Ragi crop in Goa. The Co-ordinator of the programme, Dr. Sankrita Gaonkar compered the event and proposed the vote of thanks.

This G-20 University Connect event saw a large participation of young college students from more than a dozen colleges across Goa, and two universities besides BITS Pilani. From our college a group of seven T.Y.B.Sc Botany students along with a Botany faculty Dr. Dhillan Velip participated in the G20 University Connect lectures series summit on the theme 'Climate Change and India's G-20 Presidency' at BITS Pilani, Goa Campus. The speakers for the event were Dr. Seshadri Chari, Board of Governors, RIS, New Delhi; Prof. Venkata Rao, VC, IIULER, Goa; Prof. Savita Kerkar, Dean, Goa University; and Prof. Suman Kundu, Director, BITS Pilani Goa Campus. The speakers of precautionary measures to overcome climate change disasters and also shared their research expertise and experiences with the participants. Students also received an opportunity to interact with the speakers. As part of this interaction, students asked questions and the questions were patiently answered by the dignitaries.

Further, as part of the student engagement program, an interactive quiz competition was conducted by Prof. Rajiv Kumar Chaturvedi, Associate Professor, BITS Pilani Goa, and Dr. Ramesh Kumar MR, Former Chief Scientist, NIO. A total of thirty students were adjudged winners of this quiz competition and were felicitated by the dignitaries with a memento and a certificate. The G20 University Connect event concluded with a vote of thanks by Prof. Suman Kundu, Director of BITS Pilani Goa campus.

Overall the students got an opportunity to understand how climate change will affect disasters and posing new challenges to disaster risk management in Goa and how the response to these can be improved using a Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) plan. The event was a good exposure for the students in creating awareness on sustainable resource use and its management

Exploring Wildlife Conservation at Bondla Wildlife Sanctuary and Zoo

On 15th August 2023, First Year B.Sc. Zoology Major students from Government College of Arts, Commerce, and Science in Quepem Goa embarked on an exciting field trip. The goal was to learn about animals and nature care through two different approaches: natural habitats and safe enclosures.

A group of 20 students, accompanied by faculty members Ms. Sheena Paul and Dr. Sandesh Gawas, visited the Bondla Wildlife Sanctuary and Zoo, known for its role in animal care and only Zoo in the state of Goa.

The trip allowed observation of remarkable animals such as White Spotted Deers and the impressive Malabar Giant Squirrel. Colourful butterfly species like Tamil Yeoman, Common Crow, Plains Cupid, Common Palmfly, Blue Mormon, and Common Mormon were also sighted.

At the zoo, various animals that are no longer commonly found in the wild were kept. The Zoo collection included Wild Boars, Mugger Crocodiles, the vibrant Rose Ringed Parakeets, Indian Terrapins, Indian Pythons and venomous Russell Vipers and Indian Cobras. Smaller snake species like Trinket Snakes and Sand Boas were also present. Other inhabitants encompassed Indian Bisons, Leopards, Sloth Bears, Golden Jackals, Indian Palm Civets, Porcupines, and the captivating Peacocks.



A notable insight was the Zoo's contribution to the Indian Bison breeding initiative, aimed at increasing the population of this rare species through careful planning coordinated by the Indian Government.

The visit to the butterfly garden offered a unique experience, showcasing the transformation from eggs to caterpillars and ultimately to vibrant butterflies.

In conclusion, the field trip to Bondla Wildlife Sanctuary and Zoo was an enlightening experience. It facilitated an understanding of animal care in both natural settings and controlled environments. The close encounters with these diverse creatures emphasized the importance of their preservation.
